Choose 2 tasks off the grid to have completed by the end of this half term.

<p>Make/cook / bake something that you might get in Greece. It could be sweet or savoury. Take a photo and bring it in for us.</p>	<p>Maths challenge: Plan a family holiday to Greece! Find prices (flights, hotel, food, activities). Create a budget and show your calculations. Decide how much money you'd need for 5 days; write out what you might do each day and how much you might spend.</p>	<p>Design a colourful travel brochure encouraging people to visit modern Greece. Include pictures, places to visit (like Santorini or Athens) and fun facts. Use persuasive language – make the reader want to go!</p>
<p>Design a Greek restaurant menu. Create a menu for a modern Greek restaurant. Research popular dishes like moussaka, souvlaki, and baklava. Write a short description for each dish. Decorate your menu with a Greek-inspired design or flag colours.</p>	<p>Paint or draw a modern Greek landscape – maybe Santorini's white houses, a sunset over the Aegean sea or olive groves. Use whatever medium you'd like - pastels, watercolours or pencils for example.</p>	<p>Imagine you're on holiday in Greece – maybe on an island like Santorini or in a city like Athens. Write a postcard to a friend or family member back home. Describe what you can see, smell, hear, and taste. Mention an activity you've done (swimming, visiting a market, tasting Greek food). Design the front of the postcard too!</p>
<p>Write a diary entry from the point of view of an animal or plant. Describe a day in its life – where it lives, what it eats, and what dangers it faces. Include emotions and senses to bring it to life!</p>	<p>Invent your own new animal or plant species! Draw it and describe where it lives, what it eats, and its life cycle. Give it a scientific name and explain how it fits into its habitat.</p>	<p>Write a short story or poem from the point of view of a seed. Describe what it feels like to be buried in the soil, sprout roots and grow toward the sun. Include sensory language and personification (e.g. "I stretched my roots deep into the cool, dark earth").</p>
<p>Make a shoebox habitat for an animal of your choice. Use craft materials to recreate its surroundings (forest, sea, polar region, etc.). Include a short fact card about your animal's adaptations.</p>	<p>Write down 10 interview questions that you would ask Sir David Attenborough. Present your questions neatly. As a bonus, use the internet and books to find the answers to your questions!</p>	<p>Create a set of "Habitat Top Trumps" cards. Choose 6–8 animals from different habitats (e.g. polar bear, camel, frog). Include facts such as diet, size, and special adaptations. Decorate each card and play with a friend or family member! Then bring them into school!</p>
